

**Curriculum Requirements for Major in Economics**

Core Curriculum**(46 credits)****Major in Economics****(36 credits)***Required (18 credits)*

- ECN 200 – Principles: Markets and Prices (3)
- ECN 201 – Principles: Money and Income (3)
- ECN 210 – Statistics for Business and Economics (3)
- ECN 220 – Intermediate Price Analysis (3)
- ECN 221 – Intermediate Income Analysis (3)
- ECN 450 – Seminar in Applied Economics (3)

Choose one of the following two tracks:

Economic Specialist Track (18 additional credits)

Choose 6 credits from Theory and History:

- ECN 335 – Money and Banking
- ECN 337 – Great Ideas in Economics
- ECN 438 – Development Economics

Choose 6 credits from Specialized Areas:

- ECN 410 – International Finance
- ECN 436 – Public Finance
- ECN 437 – Labor Economics

Choose 6 additional credits from within economics. MTH 126 – Calculus II may also count as a 4 credit elective (increasing total credits for the major to 37), and students considering graduate studies in economics or business are encouraged to complete Calculus II.*

Business Analyst Track (18 additional credits)

Choose 9 credits from the following electives in economics:

- ECN 335 – Money and Banking
- ECN 410 – International Finance
- ECN 438 – Development Economics
- ECN 437 – Labor Economics

Choose 9 credits from the following courses:

- ACC 102 – Principles of Accounting II*
- FIN 310 – Investments
- MGT 409 – Production/Operations Management
- MKT 332 – Marketing Research

NOTE: Accounting and Business Administration majors may be able to double-major in economics without many additional courses compared to a major-minor combination. Majors in business administration, for example, can double-major in economics with a total of just 122 credits.
