PARKING

Although parking on campus is very limited, there is no parking area on campus too far from the Student Center or the classrooms to walk. It is important that you understand the parking regulations so that you don't receive a parking ticket. The campus map on the inside will help you understand where you can and cannot park. The hanging parking permit you received when you registered your vehicle has one of the following codes printed on it: R=Resident students who live on campus, or C=Commuter student. The FS and JS stand for Freshmen-Sophomores, and Juniors-Seniors. Each group has a specific parking area. These areas are strictly enforced. **A parking permit does not guarantee students parking in the lot closest to their residence hall.** If you have any questions please ask one of the security officers so you will get accurate parking information.

TICKETING

Ticketing is done to maintain some order to parking on campus. We want to make it clear that you will receive a ticket if you violate the parking regulations. The Security Department understands that cars will often be used for quick pick-up or drop-off of items/people at residence halls and academic facilities; make sure that you use your **HAZARD LIGHTS** while your vehicle is parked for these quick pick-up or drop-off trips. Security will only allow **15-20 minutes** for hazard lights to be used. Citations will be given automatically if you are found parking on the grass, sidewalks, or in Staff spots. The map on the inside lists the fines for both parking and moving violations. Many fines are progressive with the penalty for successive violations increasing. **After you receive your sixth ticket, your vehicle may be banned from campus for the remainder of the school year.** If you have any questions contact the Director of Security & Safety or ask a Security officer.

CITATION NOTIFICATION-APPEALS

Normally after a citation has been issued, an e-mail will be sent to you to let you know the amount of the fine(s). This will normally be done within three days. After receiving a citation, if you feel the citation is unwarranted, you have seven (7) school days to appeal the citation(s) in person at the Security and Safety Office. The Director will notify you within five (5) school days of his decision.

SECURITY HELPING HAND

At Saint Joseph's College, Security isn't here just to enforce rules and regulations. The Security Department is also here to serve you.

- We have a quick start jump box if your vehicle battery is low that you can borrow with a valid ID card.
- If you have any questions that we can't answer we will do our best to point you in the right direction.
- If you have any trouble with your room after 4:00 pm weekdays, you can contact the Security Office or operator. We will check the problem and take the necessary steps to get it fixed. Be sure you contact your Resident Assistant before you contact the Security office.

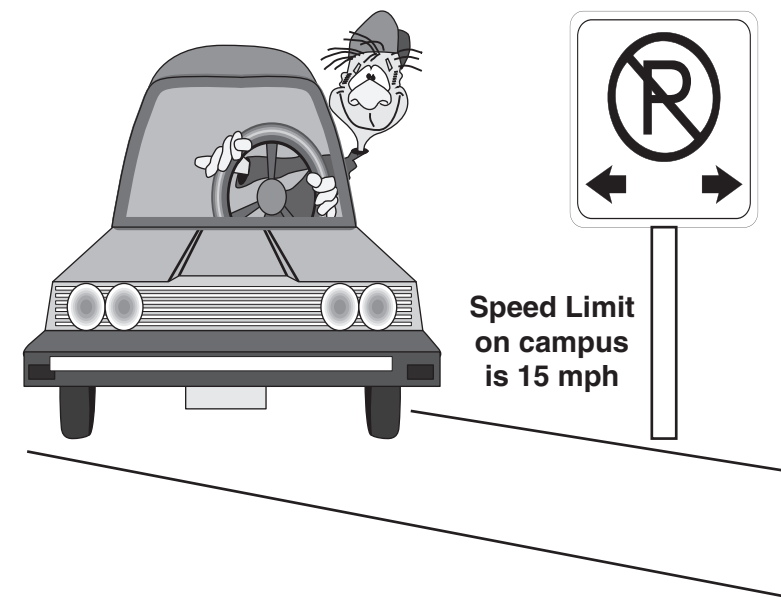
SAFETY TIPS

Hello! Welcome to Saint Joseph's College. We're very glad to have you here. The Office of Security & Safety would like your stay at SJC to be a memorable one as well as a safe one. The Security office is located in Halleck Center, lower mezzanine level, next to the public phone booths. An officer is on duty 24 hours a day, each day of the week. To contact Security, Monday through Friday, 7am-5pm, just pick up any campus phone and dial 6129 or "0" which will connect you with the switchboard operator. During these designated times the operator is in direct radio contact with Security. After 5pm, and on Saturday and Sunday, in a case of EMERGENCY ONLY, you can dial "1" from any campus phone for the Security Emergency Line.
